ORDINANCE 97-42

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOGANSPORT, INDIANA, AMENDING ORDINANCE 91-14 AND RE-ESTABLISHING THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION AND ITS GOVERNING BOARD

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Logansport, Indiana, has established the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Board of Parks and Recreation in ordinance 91-14, in accordinance with state statute, I.C. 36-10-3; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council does now desire to amend ordinance 91-14, changing the residency requirements for the Logansport School Corporation Board of Trustees appointment to the Board of Parks and Recreation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Logansport, Indiana:

Creation of Department and Board

SECTION ONE: Under the provisions of the acts of 1981 (I.C. 1981, 36-10-3 et. al.) there is hereby established a Department of Parks and Recreation composed of the Board of Parks and Recreation, administrator, superintendent, and other such personnel as the board may determine necessary.

Appointment and Qualifications of Board Members

SECTION TWO: The Board of Parks and Recreation shall be composed of four (4) members appointed by the mayor and one (1) member of the Logansport School Corporation Board of Trustees appointed by the school board. No more than two (2) members appointed by the mayor shall be of the same political party. All members shall be appointed on the basis of their interest in and knowledge of parks and recreation.

Further, the Board of Parks and Recreations members appointed by the mayor must be residents of the City of Logansport corporate limits. The Logansport School Board of Trustees appointment must be one of the trustees living within the Logansport School Corporation limits. In addition, any employee of the parks, golf course, swimming pool or park board will not be eligible for Board of Parks and Recreation appointment until one year lapses after termination of that employment.

Length of Terms, Method of Appointment

SECTION THREE: The school board member shall be appointed annually from the Logansport School Corporation Board of Trustees. The four mayoral appointees shall serve staggered four (4) year terms, with one appointee being appointed each year and the Democrat and Republican appointments alternating each year. All mayoral appointments are for a period of four (4) years. In the case of a resignation or vacancy, the mayor shall appoint a new board member to serve out the unexpired time remaining on the four (4) year term. All terms shall expire on the first day of January, but the appointee shall continue to serve until his successor is appointed.

Board Organization

SECTION FOUR: At its first regular meeting in each year the Board of Parks and Recreation shall elect a president and vice-president. The vice-president shall have authority to act as the president of the Board during the absence or disability of the president. The Board may select a secretary either from within or without its own membership.

Board Powers

SECTION FIVE: The Board of Parks and Recreation shall have the general power to perform all acts necessary to acquire and develop sites and facilities and to conduct such programs as are generally understood to be park and recreation functions. In addition to all other powers necessary to achieve the general objectives of the Board, The Board shall have, for park and recreation purposes, all the powers and duties as outlined in Indiana State Statute (I.C. 36-10-3-10 and I.C. 36-10-3-11).

Indiana State Statute (I.C. 36-10-3-10 and I.C. 36-10-3-11).

Specifically, the Board shall prepare and submit an annual budget in the same manner as other departments of city government, as prescribed by the Indiana State Board of Accounts.

Compensation

SECTION SIX: Members of the Board of Parks and Recreation may receive a salary not to exceed \$300 per year.

Gifts, Donations, & Subsidies

SECTION SEVEN: The Board of Parks and Recreation may accept on behalf of the City of Logansport and the Department of Parks and Recreation, gifts, donations and subsidies for park and recreation purposes.

Advisory Council and Special Committees

SECTION EIGHT: The Board of Parks and Recreation may create an advisory council and special committees composed of citizens interested in park and recreation programs.

Repeal

SECTION NINE: All other ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions and intent of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Passage

SECTION TEN: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOGANSPORT, INDIANA AMENDING ORDINANCE 2022-05, SETTING THE FEE SCHEDULE FOR PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE LOGANSPORT PARK & RECREATION SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Logansport Park and Recreation Board governs the facilities within the Logansport Parks Department as provided by City Council Ordinance 97-42; and

WHEREAS, the Logansport Park and Recreation Board does now seek to establish a new fee schedule amending Ordinance 2022-05 and to which it has passed Parks Board Resolution 2023-08 (Exhibit B); and

WHEREAS, the Logansport Park and Recreation Board is requesting the Common Council of the City of Logansport, Indiana to approve an ordinance with the appropriate amendments; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Logansport, Indiana that Ordinance 2022-05 is amended, and the following fees are hereby established:

SECTION 1: The following program fees shall be collected at the Muehlhausen Aquatic Center (formerly Tower Park Municipal Pool) and remitted to the Clerk-Treasurer for deposit into the General Fund:

SECTION 2: The Logansport Parks & Recreation Board is authorized to offer free swimming days to the public as is appropriate.

SECTION 3: The following fees shall be collected for various programs and activities and remitted to the Clerk - Treasurer for deposit into the Parks Non-Reverting Operating Fund:

SECTION 4: When a special event operates activity areas during an event (e.g., July 4th inflatable), the Parks Administrator is authorized to determine the number of Special Event Activity Tickets required to offset the cost of operating each activity area. Park Staff will sell activity tickets for which operators will collect the required number of tickets for that specific activity. The total of these funds collected will be remitted to the Clerk-Treasurer for deposit into the Parks Non-Reverting Operation Fund.

SECTION 5: A supply fee will be utilized to cover the cost of materials purchased for a specific program. The supply fee will be added to the program fee and remitted to the Clerk-Treasurer for deposit into the Parks Non-Reverting Operation Fund. On behalf of the Parks Board, the Parks Administrator is authorized to set a supply fee as necessary.

SECTION 6: The fees for new programs will be initially authorized by the Logansport Parks Board, as recommended by the Parks Administrator. At the end of each calendar year, new program fees must be reviewed and approved annually by the Logansport Common Council.

SECTION 7: As new programs are created, program fees will be authorized by the Logansport Parks Board based on the following expenses: Instructor fee, cost of supplies, use of the facility, and the cost of promoting the program. The Parks Administrator will recommend the program fee based on the aforementioned criteria as needed.

SECTION 8: In the event a resident of the City of Logansport is unable to pay the specific youth program fee, the Logansport Parks & Recreation Board authorizes the Parks Administrator to waive the program fee, provided the following requirements are met prior to participation in the program or activity:

Parent/guardian has completed a scholarship application that has been reviewed and approved by the Parks Administrator;

The youth applicant has been verified as living inside the boundary of the Logansport Community School Corporation;

The Parks Administrator has the applicant's documentation on file verifying and supporting the applicant's request for waiver fees.

SECTION 9: A private party which requests exclusive use of Parks Department facilities, shall pay the fees as identified in "Exhibit A", "Proposed 2023 Facility Rental Fees."

SECTION 10: Residents & non-residents are being accessed the same rental fee. A discount for facility rentals shall be offered to those non-profits of the City of Logansport that can provide proof of their tax-exempt status.

SECTION 11: Benches & bleachers are not available for rental activities. Indoor tables & chairs will only be available for rent in the facilities they are located in. As specified in "Exhibit A", rental of picnic tables are only available for public events.

SECTION 12: Rentals are available only during park operating hours of 8:00am - 10:00pm. Any exceptions to those hours must be approved by the Logansport Parks Administrator.

SECTION 13: Rental fees shall be collected at the Logansport Parks & Recreation Department office at the Penman Service Center at 1701 Dividend Dr. Logansport, In. Fees will then be received by the Clerk-Treasurer and deposited in the Parks Non-Reverting Park Operating Fund to be utilized with the annual budget.

SECTION 14: The Logansport Parks & Recreation Department will honor credit cards as prescribed by the Clerk-Treasurer's procedures for payment of the aforementioned fees related to programs, activities and facility rentals as provided by the Logansport Parks & Recreation Department.

SECTION 15: Refunds in regard to any Logansport Parks & Recreation Department fees for season tickets, trail fees, rentals, activities or programs (including those at the Municipal Pool or Municipal Golf Course) may be made with the authorization of the Parks Administrator. A full refund less a cancellation fee will be issued when the following requirements are met:

A written, signed request has been received by the Parks Administrator, from the participant requesting a program or activity refund; and

The program/activity has not been held.

Cancellation fees for paid activities will be at the rate of \$10.00; cancellation fees for facility rentals will be \$10.00 for cancellations greater than 30 days, and 50% for less than 30 days. Security deposits will be refunded in full.

There is no refund for waived fees.

SECTION 16: This ordinance amends Ordinance 2022-05 in its entirety and all other resolutions, or parts there in conflict with the provisions and intent of this ordinance.

SECTION 17: This ordinance shall be in full force and effective immediately after its passage







Q5 Would you play golf year round if you had local access to a simulator?





Q9 Would you be willing to make a financial contribution to a capital campaign, to raise funds for the construction or renovation of the existing facilities and golf course?





Executive Summary

2023 City of Logansport Parks and Recreation Needs Assessment Survey Executive Summary

Overview

ETC Institute administered a Parks and Recreation Needs Assessment Survey for the City of Logansport during the months of winter 2023. The survey will help the City of Logansport Parks and Recreation Department determine park and recreation priorities for the community.

Methodology

ETC Institute mailed a survey packet to a random sample of households in the City of Logansport. Each survey packet contained a cover letter, a copy of the survey, and a postage-paid return envelope. Residents who received the survey were given the option of returning the survey by mail or completing it online at *LogansportParksSurvey.org*.

After the surveys were mailed, ETC Institute followed up with residents to encourage participation. To prevent people who were not residents of Logansport from participating, everyone who completed the survey online was required to enter their home address prior to submitting the survey. ETC Institute then matched the addresses that were entered online with the addresses that were originally selected for the random sample. If the address from a survey completed online did not match one of the addresses selected for the sample, the online survey was not included in the final database for this report.

The goal was to complete a minimum of 300 completed surveys from city residents. The goal was met with 303 completed surveys collected. The overall results for the sample of 303 households have a precision of at least +/-5.5 at the 95% level of confidence.

The major findings of the survey are summarized on the following pages.

City Parks, Properties, and Facilities

Use of Parks, Properties, and Facilities: Respondents were asked to indicate if their household had visited any of the 23 listed Logansport parks, properties, or facilities. The highest percentage of respondents visited Riverside Park (86%), Spencer Park (82%), and Huston Park (65%). Those respondents were then asked to rate their overall level of satisfaction with those items. Respondents were most satisfied (rating "satisfied" or "very satisfied") with Huston Park (92%), Penman Service Center/Park Office (90%), and Muehlhausen Aquatic Center (90%). The four facilities respondents think are most important to their household are Riverside Park (70%), Spencer Park (59%), Huston Park (47%), and Little Turtle Waterway Trail (29%).

Rating Condition of Facilities: Respondents most often rated the physical condition of Logansport parks and recreation facilities as good (57%).

Barriers to Use: The top reasons respondents did not utilize Logansport parks and recreation facilities more often was because they did not feel safe using the parks/trails (41%), lack of features they wanted to use (36%), and lack of restrooms (35%).

Logansport Parks and Recreation Programs

Use of Programs: Respondents were asked to indicate if their household participated in any Parks and Recreation programs during the past 2 years. Forty-three percent (43%) of respondents participated. Of those participants, 58% did 2-3 programs. Eighty-three percent (83%) of participant respondents rated the programs as either excellent (21%) or good (62%).

Barriers to Participation. Respondents were asked to select all the reasons they had not participated in Logansport recreation programs more during the past two years. Respondents most often listed that they didn't know what was offered (54%) and being too busy/not interested (33%).

Organizations Used. Respondents were asked to select all the organizations that their household had used for recreation and sports activities during the last two years. Logansport Parks and Recreation (66%), River Bluff Trail (56%), and Cass County Dentzel Carousel (53%) were the most commonly used organizations.

Ways Households Learn about Programs and Activities: Respondents were asked to select all the ways they learned about Logansport Parks and Recreation programs and events. The highest number of respondents received communication via social media (62%), the Logansport parks website (51%), the local program recreation guide (38%), and newsletters/newspapers (38%). These were also the three methods respondents most prefer to learn about recreation programs and events from.

Satisfaction, Value, Funding, and Improvements

Agreement with Benefits Respondents were asked to rate their agreement with 15 statements regarding potential benefits of parks and recreation services. Respondents most agreed (selecting "agree" or "strongly agree") that park and recreation services improves household's physical health and fitness (74%), preserves open space and protects the environment (72%), and is age-friendly and accessible to all age groups (67%).

Overall Satisfaction and Willingness to Pay Additional Taxes: Respondents were asked to rate their overall level of satisfaction with the value their household receives from Logansport Parks and Recreation. Most respondents (63%) said they feel somewhat satisfied (51%) or very satisfied (12%), 25% feel neutral, and 13% feel either dissatisfied (9%) or very dissatisfied (4%). The highest percentage of respondents (40%) feel willing (25%) or very willing (15%) to have their taxes or fees increased to improve parks and recreation, 32% feel neutral, and 28% feel either not willing (14%) or not at all willing (14%). Respondents most often thought their friends, family, and acquaintances would likely feel neutral (43%) about having to pay additional taxes or fees followed by not willing/not at all willing (32%).

Perception Changes Due to COVID-19: Respondents were asked to indicate to what extent their household's perception of the value of parks, trails, open spaces, and recreation has changed given the COVID-19 Pandemic. Forty-three percent (43%) felt there was no change in their perception, 27% said it somewhat increased, and 24% said it significantly increased. Based on respondent's perception of value, the highest number of respondents (54%) feel funding for parks and recreation should increase followed by 26% believing it should stay the same.

Funding Allocation: Respondents were asked to choose how they would allocate funds for parks and recreation if provided with a \$100 budget. By average allocated, improving/maintaining existing parks and recreation facilities (\$43.90) received the highest amount of funding followed by enhancing programs and services (\$20.92) and developing new walking and biking trails (\$15.48).


Parks and Recreation Facilities and Amenities Needs and Priorities

Facility/Amenity Needs: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 36 parks and recreation facilities/amenities and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest "unmet" need for various facilities/amenities.

The three parks and recreation facilities/amenities with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

- 1. Outdoor amphitheater-2,525 households
- 2. Indoor walking/jogging track 2,438 households
- 3. Dog park (fenced, off-leash) 2,222 households


The estimated number of households that have unmet needs for each of the 36 parks and recreation amenities assessed is shown in the chart below.



Facilities and Amenities Importance: In addition to assessing the needs for each parks and recreation facility and amenity, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each item. Based on the sum of respondents' top four choices, these were the four facilities/amenities ranked most important to residents:

- 1. Multi-use paved trails (27%)
- 2. Dog park (fenced, off-leash) (22%)
- 3. Picnic areas & shelters (20%)
- 4. Playground equipment (18%), indoor walking/jogging tracks (18%), and outdoor amphitheater (18%)

The percentage of residents who selected each facility/amenity as one of their top four choices is shown in the chart below.




Priorities for Facility Investments: The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on recreation and parks investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on amenities and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the amenity. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 3 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following parks and recreation facilities/amenities were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Dog park (fenced, off-leash) (PIR= 170)
- Outdoor amphitheater (PIR= 166)
- Indoor walking/jogging track (PIR= 164)
- Multi-use paved trails (PIR= 143)
- Picnic areas & shelters (PIR= 134)
- Playground equipment for all abilities/all ages (PIR= 126)
- Social spaces (PIR= 117)
- Community gardens (PIR= 116)
- Indoor aquatic center (PIR= 105)
- Water access (PIR= 105)


Logansport Program Needs and Priorities

Program Needs: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 37 programs and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest "unmet" need for various recreation programs.

The three programs with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

- 1. Adult fitness and wellness programs 2,336 households
- 2. Community special events 1,657 households
- 3. Farmer's market 1,382 households



- 4. Historic preservation programs (15%)




The chart below shows the Priority Investment Rating for each of the 37 programs assessed.






Q2. Which FOUR parks, properties, and facilities areas listed in Question 1 are MOST IMPORTANT to you and members of your household?


Q3. Overall, how would you rate the physical condition of ALL the City of Logansport parks and recreation facilities you have visited?








Q5b. How would you rate the overall quality of recreation programs/events offered by Logansport Parks and Recreation in which your household has participated?








Q8b. Estimated Number of Households With Need For Facilities/Amenities


Q8c. How Well Households' Needs For Parks and Recreation Facilities and Amenities **Are Being Met**


Q8d. Estimated Number of Households in Logansport Whose Needs for Parks and Recreation Facilities and Amenities are 50% Met or Less


Q9. Parks and Recreation Facilities and Amenities That Are Most Important to **Respondent Households**

by percentage of respondents who selected the items as one of their top four choices






Q10b. Estimated Number of Households With Need for Programs




Q10c. How Well Households' Need For Programs Are Being Met

by percentage of respondents who indicated their household had a need for the program




Q10d. Estimated Number of Households in Logansport Whose Needs for Programs are 50% Met or Less


































Q26. What is your annual household income?


Q27. What is the primary language spoken in your home?

Priority Investment Rating

Priority Investment Rating Logansport, Indiana

The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide governments with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on parks and recreation investments. The Priority Investment Rating was developed by ETC Institute to identify the facilities and programs residents think should receive the highest priority for investment. The priority investment rating reflects the importance residents place on items (sum of top 4 choices) and the unmet needs (needs that are not met or only partly met) for each facility/program relative to the facility/program that rated the highest overall. Since decisions related to future investments should consider both the level of unmet need and the importance of facilities and programs, the PIR weights each of these components equally.

The PIR reflects the sum of the Unmet Needs Rating and the Importance Rating as shown in the equation below:

PIR = UNR + IR

For example, if the Unmet Needs Rating for Community Gardens were 98.9 (out of 100) and the Importance Rating for Community Gardens were 21.6 (out of 100), the Priority Investment Rating for the Farmer's Market would be 120.5 (out of 200).

How to Analyze the Charts:


- **High Priority Areas** are those with a PIR of at least 100. A rating of 100 or above generally indicates there is a relatively high level of unmet need and residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements in this area are likely to have a positive impact on the greatest number of households.
- Medium Priority Areas are those with a PIR of 50-99. A rating in this range generally
 indicates there is a medium to high level of unmet need or a significant percentage of
 residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas.
- Low Priority Areas are those with a PIR below 50. A rating in this range generally indicates there is a relatively low level of unmet need and residents do not think it is important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements may be warranted if the needs of very specialized populations are being targeted.




Importance Rating for Facilities/Amenities


Top Priorities for Investment for Facilities/Amenities Based on the Priority Investment Rating




Importance Rating for Recreation Programs

Top Priorities for Investment for Recreation Programs Based on the Priority Investment Rating








Rating Quality of Recreation Programs


Barriers to Facilities and Programs Use





by percentage of respondents




Respondents with Need for Park Facilities and Amenities


Respondents with Need for Recreation Programs





Q6 Where do you spend most of your free time? Please select your top three locations.






Q11 What level of school are you currently in?






Q6 How would you rate the overall quality of recreation programs/events offered by Logansport Parks and Recreation in which your household has participated?





Q16 What is your gender?





Logansport Parks Begins Master Planning Process

Logansport IN, January 20, 2023: The Logansport Parks & Recreation Department has begun the process of developing a new Five-Year Master Plan for the City's parks and recreational programs and services available to the public. The Logansport Parks and Recreation Department is looking to make some charges, and they're depending on right direction.

there are things we don't need in our parks. We'd like to know that too. This is a really good opportunity for people to have a chance to say what they want to see in our parks system."

The first round of surveys must be randomly distributed to community members to ensure they are statistically accurate.

The department hired ETC Institute, an organization that conducts surveys for govern-ment entities, to help carry out the first step of what Fawley describes as a larger master plan. After the first round of curveys, there will be multiple discussion and focus groups and possibly another survey that is open to all community members.

'For people who don't get a survey, we will make sure that they'll have an opportu-nity once we have completed the statistically valid part because we want everybody to participate who wants to participate," Fawley said. "Getting input from those people will happen, just not right this very moment in this round."

Residents who do receive the survey will find a letter Both the envelope and the explanatory letter will show the department's logo, and a aper survey will be included along with a stamped, self-addressed envelope that people can use to mail the surveys back. People also have the option to complete the sur-

vey online. Fawley said it should take about 15 to 20 minutes to complete the survey. She acknowledged that some peo-ple might ignore it because they think the survey is too long, but she urged people to set aside time to fill it out and mail it back to the parks department or complete it online.

'It's really important for us to have that information from the community," she said. "It's going to be a great stepping off point for more discussion and more surveys for everybody later on."

Fawley said she has an





The Logansport Parks & Recreation Department shared their 5-Year Master Plan to the community for input Tuesday night at Riverside Park's McHale Complex.

Those who attended had chance to view placards that showcased existing park amenities, showed options for new amenities and gave the Logansport community a chance to have their voices heard.

Attendees were able to vote on what parks they would like the city to focus on and what amenities they would like to see built. They could also share their concerns and wishes on post-it note.

The options on hand were pulled from a survey the department did and which 303 people replied to, said Janet Fawley

and multi-use paved trails. The three programs that people were most interested in focused on adult fitness and wellness, the farmers market and more community events.

Some of the amenities those who took the survey were not interested in included new sports amenities such as baseball diamonds, basketball courts, fitness and wellness equipment or an aquatic center. They also were disinterested in programs that focused on the arts, fitness and wellness and sports activities such as ice skating, gymnastics or golf and programs for those with special needs.

And while community gardens were popular in the initial survey, those in attendance Tuesday night were marking the idea as a low pri-

Dykeman Clubhouse Fundraising Closer to Goal

After conducting a local survey of 200 golfers in 2021, it was clear that Dykeman Park Municipal Golf Course needed a new clubhouse. A new clubhouse may serve as a place for yearround play through an indoor golf simulator, provide energy efficient mechanical operations, and be inclusive to all those that enter. The plan is to celebrate the course's 100th anniversary in 2026 in the new clubhouse.

With the 1st million dollars provided by the City Council, the Clubhouse Fundraising



Committee has raised -to date- a total of \$2.8 million, PLUS, \$300,000 from the Cass County Council to replace the cart paths later this year. The goal to build the Dykeman Clubhouse requires funds to be raised totaling at least \$3 million.

Thank you to those of you who have already made a commitment to support this necessary facility. Those who have considered this commitment but have not done so, now is the time to support this project.... something that all citizens of Logansport & Cass County can enjoy for vears to come!!

Spring 2024 Opening for Wright Street Bark Park



Announced this year was the transformation of the former softball field at Muehlhausen Park into Logansport's Wright Street Bark Park. The main focus for the project this year has been to raise enough funds in 2023 to hold a ribbon cutting in the Spring of 2024. The goal was to provide a 1:1 match for a \$35,000

grant from the IHCDA. Through our crowdfunding campaign, we were able to raise those funds! The Wright Street Bark Park is now being constructed to include a 5' black chain link fence, drinking fountains, benches, and a shade sail. We also expect restrooms to be renovated and available for the spring dedication.

Our personal and professional experiences help us develop and grow, and I wanted to share some of "life's lessons" that came up in 2023...

Change is a "constant" and people will always resist it.

Logansport isn't the same community it was 50, 20, or even 10 years ago. It will never be what it once was-good or bad. Change happens before our eyes EVERY DAY. Logansport is a new place to live everyday, because new people become a part of our community everyday. It is the job of public servants like me to take care of and enhance our community resources to accommodate ALL people, not just the ones that have lived here all of their lives or those who have just arrived. So this requires constant "change" to make our parks and our programs relevant to everyone.

We will always have to do a better job, no matter how much better we have been.

My Girl Scout camping experiences taught me a long time ago that I should leave a place in better condition than I found it. And so it is in the parks as well. It's always hard for my staff to come across vandalism or graffiti, especially when improving the parks is our goal. Consequently, it sometimes makes it feel like a losing battle when even maintaining something in its current state isn't enough. The answer? We simply have to be even more

tenacious in our efforts to make things better, to leave the Parks in better condition than we found it.

Listening to what people will tell you is sometimes painful.

Our Parks staff and board spent a lot of time going through the results of three different surveys this last year. It was really important for us to read through and listen to every comment, no matter how brutal some criticisms were. Listening to these comments is how we learn and how we grow. This is how we will improve our parks and improve our city.

It is important for us to share our message as often as possible and in as many ways as possible for people to hear that message.

When asked about where people received their information about what is taking place in the parks, it amazed me that there was a significant portion of the population that had no idea what was going on in the parks. We wrote an incredible number of press releases last year ... almost 70 deliberate communications were sent out in 2023. That's one every 5 days!! We used the newspaper, radio, social media, digital news, brochures, paid advertisements, flyers, and even word of mouth. So, in 2024, we'll try new ways to get that information in your hands as often, and in as many ways as possible. We hope we'll find the avenue that is right for you!

People are more likely to share their personal resources with <u>people</u> they believe in, as much as a <u>cause</u> they believe in.

We, i.e., the Parks Staff, the Parks Board, and the Parks Foundation Board—have been working together to fund a new bark park at Muehlhausen Park and a improvements for the Dykeman Park Golf Course. I know people are very interested in seeing these things happen in our community, and so they have donated their personal funds to see them happen. Without the leadership within our staff and boards, these donations would not happen. I am very grateful to have these people in my professional circle Dean Vietti, Kelly Smith, Kara Yax, Kevin Price, Dave Smith, Mike McCord, Sam Tocco, Jason Crittendon, Ammon Tuitavuki, Lynne Ness, Kyle Smith, Kailin Bauman, Phillip Stephenson, Jake McCord, & Rachel Theodore. I would also like to mention a special group of people who are also working on getting commitments for the Clubhouse project - Brad Rozzi, Chad Higgins, Michael Bowditch, Tammy Helvie, Chuck LaDow, & Brannon Meagher. I thank each of them for their leadership and their time for making our parks better now and into the future!!!

Spencer Parks' Historic Shelter To Be Stabilized



The arches of the Lower Spencer Shelter (as pictured above) are a significant architectural feature of this shelter.

In May 2023, the Logansport Parks Board met to discuss the condition and actions required to be taken at the lower shelter of Spencer Park. It was made known by a report provided by KJG Architecture that snow and wind loads cannot be safely supported by the current structure. The board decided that in order to maintain public safety that the shelter should be closed for public use. Upon the shelter's closure, the board has worked on getting the pavilion stabilized while also keeping the structure as historically accurate as possible. The goal is to have the shelter tentatively back open in the Spring of 2024.

7th Annual Christmas In The Park



For the seventh year, the Logansport Parks and Recreation Department and the Logansport Parks and Recreation Foundation offered a holiday light display at Spencer Park. Starting in July, the Logansport Parks Department began to get donations from sponsors. Christmas in the Park opened to the public on November 24th and ended following the New Year's

weekend. Homeowners on Broadway Boulevard were encouraged to decorate their homes this year due to vehicles using Broadway to enter Christmas in the Park.

Logansport Parks Depend Upon Parks Maintenance Crew

The work of maintaining and improving the Parks in the City of Logansport falls upon the Parks Maintenance Crew, led by Maintenance Superintendent, Kevin Price. Our maintenance crew takes a great deal of pride in every park's appearance. They work extremely hard to make the city parks the best possible. Without their dedication & tireless efforts, many community events would suffer.

This list is a small sampling of the work that is regularly performed by the Parks Maintenance Crew year round:

- Inspect all playgrounds for necessary repairs & maintenance
- Turf management which includes mulching leaves, application of fertilizer & herbicide, roll ground as well as mowing & weed whipping in appropriate parks
- Repair & replace vandalized equipment & facilities
- Clean restrooms & pavilions daily; remove trash
- ♦ Snow removal
- Enhance landscaping through use of flowerbeds






